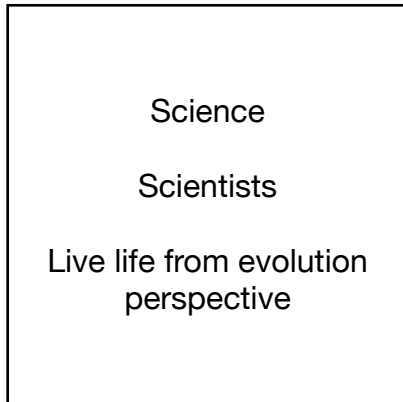
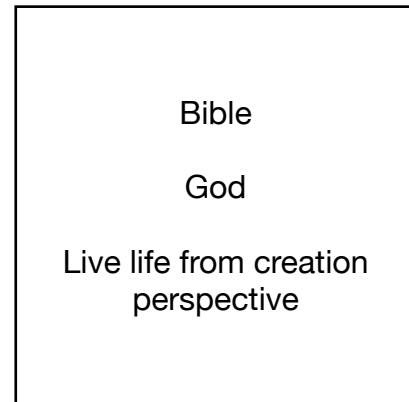


Evolution



Creation



Cannot live life from the middle of this perspective. You either believe that you are a part of [Evolution](#) or [Creation](#).

To walk in an uncertainty directly affects the identity of the believer (You/Me). Both perspectives are affected by uncertainty and require faith. The evidence of what happens in our lives depends on the perspective in which we choose to experience it from.

The analytical (relating to or using analysis or **logical reasoning**) individual tends to struggle with the concept of creation. There is nothing *logical* (clear and sound reasoning) about creation. A world is put together by WORDS. A mighty God seeks relationship with His delicate creation. There are demons and angels; absurd stories; and undeniable miracles. Creation requires a small mind to grasp a grand concept, whereas evolution better conforms to the notion of the concrete (“it is what you see.”) How you experience life is based on your perspective.

There are different conclusions about the “Beginnings” because of old evidence and fragmented information. Students of science shouldn’t force science to say something that it isn’t saying and students of the Bible shouldn’t force the Bible to say something that it isn’t saying.

The world is not a result of blind chance and probability. God created it. Something as minor as how an ant operates in the field or something major like how a woman can carry and give birth to a child are all functions that are intentional and complicated. Those cannot happen by mere chance. The many species that exist on earth and even the fact that earth is floating around without crashing into the sun is evidence of a wise and thoughtful creator. Science is important and helps us to understand many things in this world. It functions to fulfill the curiosity of human intellect. It just isn’t the creator of the things it studies.

The Bible tells us that the world was created by God. It talks about who God is, His character, and plans for creation. It shows God’s desire to have relationship with us (His creation). The Bible doesn’t discuss evolution. On the other hand, the Bible’s worldview assumes that God created the world. The biblical view doesn’t conflict with science but with any worldview that starts without creation.

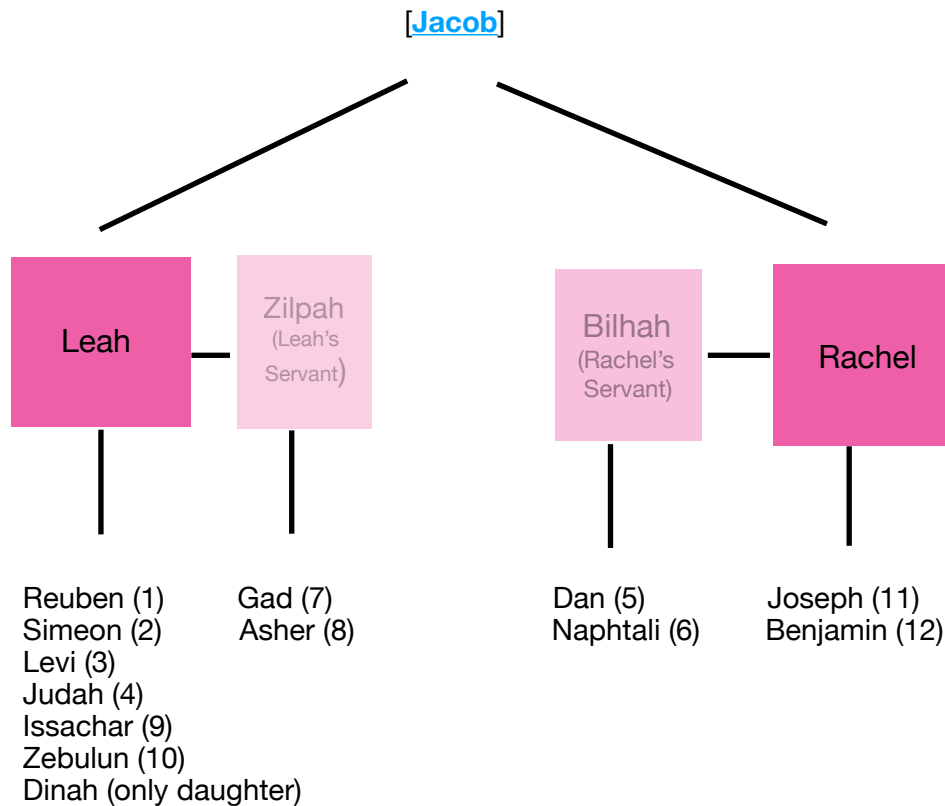
Day #1: Light
